Shorten it (apostrophes to show missing letters) - an apostrophe can be used in place of missing letters. When we join words together, we use an apostrophe to show where letters have been missed out.

Look for ways to remember them.

- Do they rhyme?
- Can you make up a silly sentence to help you e.g. **because** -
big elephants can't always use small entrances
- What sounds can you hear / see in the word?
- Which part of the word is the tricky bit?
- How can I remember the tricky bit?

See if you can spell them without looking. Ask an adult to say the word in a sentence and you write it down. Carefully check to see if you were right.
