<u>Words and suffixes</u> - some long words are made up of a short word a suffix. A suffix is a set of letters you can put at the end of a word to change the meaning.

When you add est or er to a word that doesn't end in e, you just add the suffix and the spelling stays the same

When you add est or er to a word that ends in e, remove the final e first When you add est or er to a word that ends in a consonant and a y, change the y to an i first.

<u>Words and suffixes</u> - some long words are made up of a short word a suffix. A suffix is a set of letters you can put at the end of a word to change the meaning.

When you add est or er to a word that ends in a short vowel sound and a consonant, you need to double the last letter before adding the suffix.

saddest flattest wettest thinnest sadder flatter wetter thinner

Here are 10 tricky words that you need to learn to spell this week.

Remember you can't just sound these words out; they all have tricky parts to them.

Some words we have done before. We are recapping them.

Look for ways to remember them.

- Do they rhyme?
- Can you make up a silly sentence to help you e.g. because big elephants can't always use small entrances
- What sounds can you hear / see in the word?
- Which part of the word is the tricky bit?
- How can I remember the tricky bit?

See if you can spell them without looking. Ask an adult to say the word in a sentence and you write it down. Carefully check to see if you were right.
